MEET THE NSA

The National Stuttering Association is the largest nonprofit organization in the world dedicated to bringing hope and empowerment to children and adults who stutter, their families, and professionals, through support, education, advocacy, and research.

Nearly 100% of those supporting our work-either as board members, staff, or other supporters-are people who stutter, family members of people who stutter, or speech professionals.

WHAT IS STUTTERING?

Stuttering is a speech disorder that causes interruptions in the natural flow of speech. It can show up as repeating sounds or syllables, stretching out certain sounds, or getting "stuck" on a word with a noticeable pause or block. Everyone stumbles over their words sometimes, but for people who stutter, these disruptions happen more often and can make speaking feel like a challenge.

While stuttering varies from person to person, one thing is clear—it doesn't define intelligence, personality, or capability.






EXAMPLES OF PAST SPEAKERS
