

Title: Serial recall and cognitive effort in adults who do and do not stutter

Researchers at the Speech Fluency lab, Department of Speech, Language, Hearing Sciences, University of Minnesota, are studying serial recall of new words among adults who stutter.

Prospective participants are native American English-speaking adults who stutter, aged between 18-50 years, with no history of other speech, language, hearing difficulties/disorders, and must be able to participate onsite. Participants will be recruited through an intake screening form. Eligible participants will repeat sequences of new words and the effects of cognitive effort on task performance will be assessed using physiological and self-reported survey measures.

Flexible scheduling (weekday or weekend scheduling) for a session lasting 2.5 to 3 hours is available. Participants will be compensated \$16 per hour and provided free permit to a parking lot near the study location.
